What was the brief for this bathroom? While our clients wanted this bathroom to be serene and beautiful, it firstly had to tick all their boxes: it needed to have both a separate bath and shower (ideally a walk-in shower), the bath had to be big enough to bathe two kids at the same time, and it had to have enough storage for all the children’s toiletries and small bath toys.

Were there any challenges along the way? The main challenge was fitting in a separate large bath and walk-in shower and repositioning the toilet on the entry wall behind the door.

What do you love about this space? The choice of materials, fixtures and fittings is what makes this bathroom special – from the hand-cut feature gloss tiles on the back wall to the large-format floor terrazzo tiles in soft greys, punctuated by the brushed brass tapware.
